FOR STUDENTS

As a starting point for our support for students, MCEC conducted direct, specialized training for 555 students through a variety of programs, including:

- Frances Hesselbein Student Leadership Program a 5-day training program held in the fall of 2023 at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point.
- The inaugural Hidden Helpers Student Leadership Program sponsored by WWP and held at the University of Texas at San Antonio - a 5-day program that helped youth from families providing care to a wounded service member prepare to be college-, work-, and life-ready following high school graduation.
- Student 2 Student® (S2S™) our signature peer-to-peer support program that provided training as a component of six MCEC 360 Summits and 11 additional standalone trainings. 360 Summits are fun, informative events which offer content for students, parents and education professionals. Through S2S, both military and non-military students step up as ambassadors who welcome and help acclimate newly arrived students to their campus.
- The 5th Annual San Antonio S2S Jamboree, held in partnership with UTSA and H-E-B welcomed over 100 students from 18 local schools to develop leadership skills, gain knowledge to improve and sustain their S2S programs, network with other S2S programs, and grow as a team.



FOR PARENTS

MCEC supports parents with direct engagement and in-person opportunities and also extends outreach to parents through online content to address topics that are both timely and timeless.

- We reached nearly 900 parents and children through 30 Tell Me a Story[®] events across several states, through MCEC 360 Summits and standalone community engagements. This popular program uses literature to foster resilience, strengthen parent-child connections and create a sense of pride.
- We reached an additional 1,512 parents and children through 46 Parent Workshops and Speedometry events.
- We held 55 live webinars on topics such as Mid-year Moves, Test-Taking Skills, Perfectionism, and Cyberbullying. The live sessions enabled direct Q&A engagement and are also available on-demand and online for easy access and convenience.
- We produced 39 informative new podcast episodes with 10,900 downloads. The #1 episode downloaded was "Harmful Behaviors are a Form of Communication" - a topic that addresses the needs and challenges all parents face.

FOR PROFESSIONALS

Hundreds of professionals received intensive, specialized training including:

- Seventeen Professional Development trainings delivered via MCEC 360 Summits and standalone events.
- Seven "Purple Star Readiness" ECHO Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) and three "Military-Connected Youth in Caregiver Roles" ECHO PLCs.
- Training for 326 S2S Sponsors representing 180 schools.
- Seven Purple Star School Support virtual trainings.
- Seven major Professional Development events on "Serving Military-Connected Students" trained over 400 participants.

New and Existing Resources

MCEC maintains an online library of evidence-informed resources (some also available in Spanish) to help parents, professionals, and children face challenges associated with the military lifestyle. Two important resources added this year are:

- The MCEC Military Child Well-Being Toolkit, funded by BAE Systems, provides content fostering emotional intelligence (EI), mindfulness, and overall well-being for children. It also supports children and families living with posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD), traumatic brain injury (TBI), and other injuries. The toolkit serves as a guide to help families discuss and address sensitive topics affecting a child's overall well-being.
- Helping Kids Work Through the Fear and Consequences of Global *Violence* connects families, educators, and other professionals to resources that offer ways to discuss complex world events with care.

FOR ACTION

Military Student Consultants

MCEC's Military Student Consultants (MSCs), sponsored by USAA, are our direct line of individual support, staffed by certified professionals with experience serving military and veteran families. They understand the challenges related to academic transition, family transition, and socialemotional transition, and use that insight to guide parents, professionals, students and installation personnel. MSCs responded to 250 individual cases and requests across 41 states assisting:

Purple Star School-Focused Events

MCEC is the national advocate for Purple Star Schools (PSS), a designation indicating schools have the knowledge and programming to most effectively support military-connected children as they change duty stations with their service member parents. The initiative helps schools better understand and respond to the students' educational and social-emotional challenges. PSSs are surging across the country (40 states and over 3,000 schools). MCEC participated in a national conference promoting PSSs and is the nation's most complete resource for schools aspiring to Purple Star designation. MCEC helped prepare schools by providing:

- 14 PSS-focused professional services events, serving 140 participants
- 52 PSS-focused issues were addressed by Military Student Consultants
