DoDEA Grant Program

Catalyst for DoD Community Partnership

- Through a competitive process,
 DoDEA awards grants to military
 connected public school districts.
- A rigorous evaluation is required to maintain focus on grant objectives and ensure accountability.
- DoDEA grants have a broad reach [35 states] to public school districts that have high concentrations of militaryconnected students.
- Authority: 20 U.S.C. 7730 (b) note.

Return on Investment

- The Department's ability to influence educational outcomes is best leveraged through community partnerships with school districts and professional organizations.
- The resources provided to military-connected school districts allow for the expansion of existing programs as well as fund innovative solutions to meet the academic, social and emotional needs of the highly mobile military-connected students in their community.
- It is important to emphasize that these school districts qualify for the resources because of military-connected student enrollment, but every student in their learning community receives the opportunity to benefit from these resources.
- Military and Community Partnerships have proven to have great impact towards the Department's collective promise in the pursuit of educational excellence for military-connected students.
