Tech/Wi-Fi Frequently Asked Questions

Where can we find help getting access to Wi-Fi at home and in getting remote learning devices to support our child's distant learning academic requirements?

Please reach out to your district and/or campuses to inquire about technology equipment checkout procedures and Wi-Fi assistance. Most districts have a technology plan in place to assist families. If your district does not have a surplus of technology to develop a student checkout procedure, some local businesses have offered assistance to families. Please contact your district for recommendations.

Many school districts have expanded their Wi-Fi signal range to include the surrounding parking lots of district buildings. A few districts have also placed school buses throughout neighborhoods as Wi-Fi hotspots for families.
